Congratulations to these outstanding AHS seniors! And thank you to all alumni whose donations made these scholarships possible!



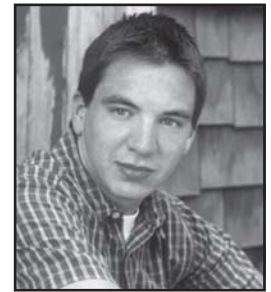

Two Ames schools close, new middle school opens

The Ames Community School Board approved a budget in May 2005 that closed Roosevelt and Northwood Elementary Schools. The budget was designed to cover a projected short fall of \$1.3 million due to declining enrollment in the Ames Community School District;. The 6-1 vote was met with tears, anger and disappointment from the 100 people in attendance. A passionate parent organization was unsuccessful in trying to save one school by presenting alternative budget options to the school board. "Our entire community is indeed sadly affected by the loss of two schools," said board member Jane Acker. Roosevelt celebrated its 80th anniversary this year. Northwood was opened in 1970.

As two elementary schools were closed, the Ames Community School District opened a new middle school. The new school is located at 3915 Mortensen Road and cost \$26 million. The middle school now houses grades 6, 7 and 8 while the elementary schools teach Kindergarten through 5th grade.

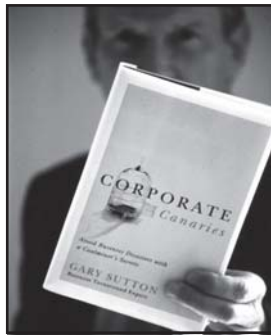

Alumni Still Aiming High

Virginia (Larson) Hash '45 was named the 2005 Volunteer of the Year by both the Clay County Public School System and the Clay Country Literacy Coalition in Middleburg, Florida. For 33 years, Hash was a professor at the University of Northern Iowa, where she directed several international programs and developed language programs. After retiring, she and her husband moved to Florida to be near their daughter, Jean. Since then, Hash has volunteered at an elementary school teaching science and has written grants to equip a science lab. She also volunteers 20 hours a week teaching English to adults. "She is just a dynamo when it comes to her commitment to literacy and making people's lives better," said Pat Coffman, coalition board member. "It's something she has really taken to heart."

Gary Sutton '60 authored a book titled "CORPORATE CANARIES...Avoid Business Disasters With a Coalminer's Secrets." The book tells how to know when an organization is headed for trouble. Sutton has been a turnaround CEO for three decades, taking over troubled businesses and attempting to fix them. His new book uses several Iowa scenes.



Steve Ward '69 was named a Mid-Iowa Unsung Hero by the Ames Tribune. Ward has been the head of the Court Appointed Special Advocates program for 5 years. The goal of the program is to have one devoted volunteer be a voice for abused or neglected children who are involved in the juvenile court system. "He has devoted his life to this service," said Katy Simutis who nominated Ward. "I think what matters to him is that he's doing something to better the lives of people."

Don DoBell '80 was named a Mid-Iowa Unsung Hero by the Ames Tribune. DoBell teaches band to students at St. Cecilia School and also is the volunteer conductor for the Heartland Senior Band. Marilyn Johnson nominated DoBell and wrote: "Thank you for encouraging young and old to pursue their musical aspirations." DoBell also recently received an Ames Community Arts award, the Bill Pelz Spirit Award.

Mark Kislingbury '81 broke his own world record by writing machine shorthand at 360 words per minute for one minute and transcribing it with 97.22% accuracy. The 2006 Guinness Book of World Records printed Kislingbury's 2003 world record. Kislingbury is also a seven-time winner of the National Court Reporters Association's speed and real-time contests.

Lt. Col. DeWayne Knott '64 gave a tribute to Ames' veterans and soldiers during the annual Memorial Day celebration at the Ames Municipal Cemetery. Knott spoke about the difficulty of being separated from someone in the military, as he and his wife both served in Iraq at different times. "I can report to you the harder job between the battle front and home front is waiting," he said. "Waiting at home, while the one you hold dear is in harm's way." Knott continued to thank veterans and family members for the work done and sacrifices made. "Again, we thank all the veterans. Those veterans who have served a grateful nation in the past, those future veterans who are currently serving their country and the world, and finally, we thank you on the home front."



Troy Rutter '92 recently published a how-to book on getting your child into the TV/Film industry titled "Kids in the Biz: A Hollywood Handbook for Parents." Troy spent seven years in California working for Warner Bros., Universal Studios and CBS doing everything from designing and maintaining the web sites for "Babylon 5," "The West Wing," "Rosie O'Donnell," "Friends," and more - to being a writer on the game show "Pictionary". In 1998, he appeared three times on the TV show "7th Heaven," which allowed him the opportunity to join the Screen Actors Guild. Troy has since relocated back to Ames and was one of the lead characters in the musical "The Fantasticks" presented by ACTORS.

Virginia Cronin '98 received a juris doctor (J.D.) degree from William Mitchell College of Law, St. Paul, MN. She received a Bachelor of Science degree from Iowa State University in 2002, a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Iowa in 2003. She was also the recipient of the Century Scholarship, Iowa State Scholarship and the E. Willard and Charles R. Murname Scholarship. For the next year, she will be doing a judicial clerkship for the first Judicial District of Iowa.

Anne Legg '01 was named Most Valuable Player of Central College softball team. She is a four-year starter and a 2005 co-captain. Her senior year, she hit .392 with 12 doubles, four home runs and 22 RBIs. Legg set school records for career batting average (.379), doubles (48), times on base (267) and putouts (1,352). She finished second on the career RBI chart (100), third in hits (188) and 13th in games played (172). She was a first-team all-Iowa Conference selection and a third-team NFCA Division III all-Midwest Region selection.

To the Ames High Alumni Association,

We are the co-chairs of the Ames Veterans Memorial Committee, which was authorized by the Ames Patriotic Council to undertake the planning and construction of a public veterans memorial for Ames. The goal of the memorial is to honor the veterans from all eras, both wartime and peacetime. We are writing to invite all Ames High Graduates and their families and friends to assist with this important community project.

The committee has been working hard for more than two years, and we have made considerable progress. We sought a prominent public site, one that would be regularly visible to large numbers of people. Mayor Tedesco and the City Council have approved the use of the city-owned lot on the northeast corner of 5th and Grand, a superb location.

We also wanted a design that would embody four main themes. These are:

- * honoring the contributions of all who have served our country in both wartime and peacetime
- * making a special memorial to those who have fallen
- * educating young people about the value of freedom and the sacrifices needed to sustain our liberty
- * inspiring all members of the community to continued service

To accomplish this, the Veterans Memorial Committee solicited design concepts from several Iowa artists. The committee has chosen a concept submitted by Christopher Bennett of Keosauqua, who has designed and constructed a number of public memorials and sculptures in Iowa. The design incorporates a flag and pole and figures of an eagle, representing the necessity of strength, and a dove, representing the goal of peace. The site will have a curved wall, stone benches, and nice landscaping.

We have been working hard to build community support. Our committee has broad representation from veterans groups, civic activists, the business community, and arts groups. We have had strong cooperation and support from the Mayor, the City Council, the city staff, and the Public Art Commission. We have received endorsements from virtually every civic organization in Ames.

The Ames Foundation, an organization with an established record and reputation in local philanthropy, has agreed to serve as the fiscal agent for the project. Since the Foundation is a tax-exempt organization, donations made through that entity will be tax-deductible to the extent permitted by law.

Over 200 individual donations have already been received, in addition to donations from over 50 businesses and organizations. Many other pledges have been received. Several businesses have pledged in-kind contributions of labor and/or materials for the construction of the memorial. In all, approximately \$80,000 has been committed to the project already.

We would like to invite all Ames High graduates and the families and friends to help make the memorial a reality. Tax-deductible donations may be made by sending a check payable to "Ames Foundation - Ames Veterans Memorial" to the Foundation at P.O. Box 213, Ames, 50010.

We particularly would like to call your attention to a special feature of the donation campaign. A brick walkway will lead into the center of the memorial. Each donor of \$125 or more may dedicate a brick to be engraved with the name of a veteran or other person or organization. The names of veterans will be indicated by a special star in the engraving. Donors may designate multiple bricks for donations in multiples of \$125.

Our goal is to raise a total of \$170,000 so that construction may begin within the next year. To reach this goal will be a challenge. However, we firmly believe from the expressions of support we have already received that this goal is feasible and that the result will be a fitting memorial of which our community will be proud for years to come.
